
April 26, 2018 Meeting Minutes

General Financial Report: Connie P. Tonie L.	General Fund: 1. Connie reported that Maumee Valley Guidance Center has agreed to manage the coalition funds, taking over for Family Service. She reported that MVGC received a check from FSNO on March 21, 2018 in the amount of \$1,653. 96 2. Tonie informed the members that becoming a 5013c was still on the table, but that would not be addressed for several months.	1. Coalition General Fund Balance: \$1,653.96

Billie Jo will continue to update the members on MHFA trainings.

The mission of the Four County Suicide Prevention Coalition is to increase awareness, decrease stigma, and increase people's ability to seek help aimed at suicide prevention.




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<p>LOSS update: Tonie L., Mandy W</p>	<p>LOSS Activity since 03/22/2018 (last meeting):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tonie reported that there have been 2 deaths by suicide in the four county area: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1 Fulton County • 1 Henry County 2. Tonie also informed the group that the Henry County death required the collaboration of the LOSS Team and the CISM Team due to the traumatic event exposure of individuals employed at the location of the death. Connie Planson briefly informed the members on the service the CISM Team provides, as well as frequency of activity in the four county communities. 3. Tonie informed the members that there would be a LOSS Team replacement training on Saturday, May 19th from 9:00a to 2:00p. There would be 4 new volunteers trained to respond to deaths by suicide. 4. Tonie reported that the LOSS Law Enforcement activation procedures have changed. On call will now carry a cell phone that police and the coroner can call directly. Materials have been printed to educate emergency personnel about the changes. Tonie will distribute the materials. 5. Mandy informed the group that the LOSS Team would be attended the screening of “The Ripple Effect – The Kevin Himes Story” on April 16, 2018. The LOSS Team members present also participated in the post-movie discussion. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tonie will continue to update the Coalition members regarding LOSS activity.
<p>Update on School based Prevention: Tonie L. Bethany S.,</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Alma C. from FCFC sent a report that was shared on her behalf by Tonie L. Since the March FCSPC meeting FCFC presented SOS at the following Schools: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wauseon Middle School - 76 students served, with 5 students help-seeking. 2. Bethany S’s of MVGC reported her youth prevention activity as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bethany served the 9th grade students at Ayersville High School on April 5th & 6th 2018. 17 were educated, 08 students were screened, 4 answered “yes” to 3 or more questions, and 1 was determined to be at-risk for suicide. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Bethany S will continue to provide SOS and other youth prevention/education service to area students.



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bethany served 7th grade students at Ayersville Middle School on April 5th & 6th 2018. 44 students were educated, 14 were screened, 02 answered "yes" to 3 or more indicators, and 1 was determined to be at risk for suicide. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Tonie reminded the members that all youth suicide prevention services will now be provided by MVGC effective May 1, 2018. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Reports will continue to be provided to the coalition.
<p>PCP Presentations – Tonie L., Jen C.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tonie reported there was one PCP presentation held since the March 2018 meeting as follows: 2. Hicksville Community Memorial Hospital - Tonie and Jen Casertano presented to Hicksville staff. The providers reported that they were not currently screening regularly. The result of the presentation was the provider's agreement to screening patients 2 times a year using the PHQ2, PHQ9, and the ASQ for youth aged 10-24 years old. 3. Jen noted that the presentation was very well received, and that this would conclude PCP presentation in Defiance county. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tonie will continue to encourage early screening and assessment throughout the 4-county area. 2. Tonie and Jen will continue to report to the coalition.

Tonie reported that she had presented as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Montpelier Hospital (general) – 4/9/2018 • Fulton County Health Department (screening) – 4/19/2018 2. Tonie also informed the group that she and Drena Teague would be providing training to guidance counselors and administrators on response to student death by suicide on 06/07/2018. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tonie will continue to update the coalition.
